Preceptors in Action




Preceptors volunteer their time and energy to teach in the clinical setting. By evaluating preceptees, preceptors are helping to ensure that they possess the knowledge, skills and attitudes necessary for nursing practice.

Feedback and Evaluation



Feedback is the act of providing your observations and assessment with your preceptee. It should be timely, objective and contain specific directions regarding areas of improvement. Evaluation has a larger scope or focus and should include a broader review of performance and skills.

Evaluation is a process that should occur throughout the entire learning experience. Many preceptors find evaluation to be an unpleasant task.


